## Function Rule

A function rule describes the relationship between inputs and outputs. A function can be written as an equation in two variables.


## EXAMPLE (1) Writing an Equation in Two Variables

Write an equation for "The output is five less than the input."
Words The output is five less than the input.
Equation $y=x-5$
$\therefore$ An equation is $y=x-5$.

## EXAMPLE 2 Evaluating a Function

What is the value of $y=2 x+5$ when $x=3$ ?

$$
\begin{aligned}
y & =2 x+5 & & \text { Write the equation. } \\
& =2(3)+5 & & \text { Substitute } 3 \text { for } x . \\
& =11 & & \text { Simplify. }
\end{aligned}
$$

$\therefore$ When $x=3, y=11$.

## Study Tip

A solution of an equation with two variables is an ordered pair that makes the equation true.

## EXAMPLE \& Real-Life Application

The maXair ride can accommodate 1000 riders in an hour.
a. Write an equation that relates riders and time.
b. How many people can ride the maXair each day?
a. Words Number equals the number times the number of riders of riders per of hours.

Variables Let $r$ be the number of riders.
Let $h$ be the number of hours.
Equation $r=1000$ • $h$
$\therefore$ An equation is $r=1000 h$.

Cedar Point Park Hours
10:00 A.M.-10:00 P.M.
b. The park is open for 12 hours. Substitute 12 for $h$ in the equation from part (a).

$$
\begin{aligned}
r & =1000 h & & \text { Write the equation. } \\
& =1000(12) & & \text { Substitute } 12 \text { for } h . \\
& =12,000 & & \text { Multiply. }
\end{aligned}
$$

$\therefore$ Each day, 12,000 people can ride the maXair.
